Embracing Change and Acceptance Through the Use of Dialectical Behavior Therapy in Substance Use Counseling Kim Pinkston, LCPC, CADC, BC-DMT, GL-CMA and Don Pinkston, LCSW, CADC, ATE, ADHD-CCSP

Dr. Marsha Linehan, the creator of Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), had a goal to assist individuals in finding "a life worth living". In our role as substance use counselors, we engage with those dealing with behaviors impacting their quality of life, aiming to guide them in discovering their own "life worth living". DBT's fundamental concept revolves around acceptance versus change, emphasizing the synthesis of these opposites. It encourages working towards both acceptance and change, not viewing them as mutually exclusive. The challenge is to navigate moments where change may be difficult or impossible. This workshop will delve into teaching clients and ourselves to embrace acceptance and change through a DBT lens and interventions.

Research indicates that African Americans with substance use disorders have lower program completion rates in substance use disorders treatment and drug courts. This often leads to a return to drug use, families in despair, violation of probation and parole, and recidivism. In this workshop, you will learn strategies to work more effectively with African American clients with substance use disorders. Topics covered include: the ten things African Americans with substance use disorders need from counselors to increase program completion rates and outcomes; effective cross-cultural counseling with African American clients; working with African Americans with substance use disorders from a cultural context; special issues related to work with African American young adults; and facilitating recovery with African American clients through partnerships between treatment and the community.

Gender-Affirming Care: Navigating Mental Health & Substance Use Disorders Working with Transgender, Genderfluid, Gender Nonconforming Folks

Kristina Padilla, LAADC, ICAADC, NGCRC, C-SAT

This workshop delves into the needs of LGBTQIA2/transgender, genderfluid, and Gender Nonconforming individuals who seek treatment for mental health and/or substance use disorders. Best practices for trans youth and adults, gender dysphoria, gender-affirming hormone therapy (GAHT), and more will be discussed. Clinical, non-clinical, and personal perspectives through this presenters lived experience as a gay/trans/genderfluid/2spirit person will be shared.

IDHS/SUPR Gambling Services: Becoming a Gambling Informed State

Are you aware that over 1 million people in Illinois experience problem gambling or are at risk for problem gambling? Gambling is prevalent in Illinois through the lottery, video gaming terminals, casinos, and sports betting. However, it's important to understand that what starts as a recreational activity can for some, escalate into a significant problem. Signs of problem gambling include irritability, anxiety, secrecy, and financial dependence. Individuals with substance use disorders or mental health issues may be more prone to developing problematic gambling behaviors. Since the early 2000s, IDHS/SUPR has provided extensive problem gambling training, intervention, and public awareness in Illinois. This session updates participants on the state's gambling services in 2024 and outlines IDHS/SUPR's goals to become a Gambling Informed State.
